I've even invited the sun


In the event of bad weather (unlikely) I will provide a gas cooker.

#### VISIT the SPORTS INJURY CLINIC

Don't Know how ?? - - Well Read on.....

- 1. Phone Rainbow Slides in Stirling on 01786 462521. Ask for an appointment at the Sports Injury Clinic.
- They will ask you if you are a member tell them that you are a member of FVO.Give them our Membership Number ( 320 )
- 3. They will say "welcome" This will cost you £6.75 Per session. (If the club was not a member of the Stirling Sports Council it would cost you £9.50)

There are two sessions a week - Monday and Thursday between 7 & 8pm. You have to see the Doctor first before you get treatment - This Doctor is there only on the Monday.

With the Specialist Facilities there, you should rapidly be on the way to a full recovery.

lathy demonstrated to the massed assembly field how tricky the area vas - taking 4 minutes to find the last control - in full view of everyone!


