- * We have had a formal invitation from West Area Committee, actively encouraging us to re-join the West Area.

On balance, the Committee's view is now that we re-join the WEST area.

TEAM MANAGER SPOT

Congratulations to all those FVO members who made the effort to travel south for the JK near Dorking at Easter. (For the uninitiated, the JK is a 2-day individual race and a relay every Easter, and is on a par with the British Championships as the most important races open to all held every year in Britain). This year, the individual races were runnable but also tough and hilly, particularly on the Sunday. The most notable FVO results were Lisa finishing 3rd on W18A on Day 2 (and top Brit), and the injured Peggy beating the injured Cathy by one second on W21Elite on Day 1. And Maureen and John Brown found themselves on the same course - I don't know what Maureen said to John after she beat him on Day 1, but he improved his result significantly on Day 2 to gain his revenge!

Monday's relays were on a flat and fast heathland area normally used for military training. The FVO team on the Men's Short was a model of consistency, remaining 56th throughout, and Women's Short team ran well, but was classed non-competitive, with a runner from another club filling in for the injured Peggy. For the Men's Open and Women's Open, the JK relay was the first of the 4 races making up the 1999 UK Relay League, where points are awarded to the top 20 clubs in each race. Both FVO teams ran strongly, the men holding on well after Steve Nicholson brought them back in the leading pack on leg 1 (9.1km in 44mins!). At the end, both teams were 14th in their respective races, and both were 2nd Scottish team: a good start to the UK relay league and one that both teams will be looking to improve upon at the British and Scottish Relays.
