

Planners comments

Well didn't you all feel lucky. Such short courses. Apleasant stroll in the park. I don't think so! Grotty is too pretty a word for South Achray (North) in its present half-felled state. When looking around for control sites, however, I felt that the deep heather and brashed forest offered the ideal area for a Scottish Club's Championships.

The orange course proved a bit of a challenge (in the planning sense) as the area immediately next to the car park had been felled. The youngsters, however, seemed to have no problems, unlike a number of the oldies. All light green and longer courses were planned to be hell, but short. There was no option.

Controllers comments

I was dismayed to find that the planner intended to allow FVO club members to get away with so little at these (most prestigious) Club Championships and so had to insist that courses, if they were to be so short, should at least be a little physically challenging. Location of some of the control sites was a little suspect for the first version of the courses and had to be improved to ensure that visibility was suitably restricted from all angles to allow fairness of competition.

I was relieved that the planner was able to reduce the number of unnecessary controls out in the forest from 23 to 17. To be quite frank I felt competitors would not have wished to visit a number of the sites, particularly the 'boulder in thick forest', which would more appropriately have been described as 'boulder in brashed felled area/marsh'. I did not think that you would have been impressed.

In summary I felt that the planner produced excellent and exciting courses on a tough challenging area.

Registration/Start/Finish Officials comments

It's so easy running the registration, start and finish at the Club Champs that I can look after two kids as well.


Circuit Training
