

I am writing this as the Scotlandsgaloppen series for 2000 comes to an end. The last event I did before the grand finale at Newcastleton (the Tinto Twin) was at Leachdann Tom na Croich, near Pitlochry and I have to say I was not impressed with several aspects. Whilst not a great forest more could have been made of it. Many of the legs encouraged road/ride running but with small changes this could have been reduced. There were other aspects of the planning which were not great either. The best part, the open moorland could easily have been used more extensively on my course; as it was the course was distinctly on the short side. Had I not made a five minute (plus!) error I would have got round in about 45 minutes yet I think the recommended winning time is around 55 minutes.

Not only was the planning poor. The results arrangement was strange. If you sent off the normal two SAE's you had the second returned with the final details telling you to purchase results for £1 on the day. Personally I did not bother - partly because it was not obvious on the day but also because I felt the system was not a good one. If we've been using SAE's for years why change? Where it's a huge event and the results booklet is large there is perhaps some justification for making a charge to reduce unnecessary multiple copies but for an SG event it's only a few pages.

Cost:




Sunday was a short relay competition followed by an unsuccessful hunt for Will's car keys in the heather!

From our European Correspondent,

"Well we are successfully installed down here in the South of France, and avid watchers of the UK weather reports for comparison purposes! The latest weather has even caused problems down here though, with flights northwards cancelled as London and Paris airports succumbed to the tempest.

We are now very good customers of the local DIY store – Leroy Merlin – where we seem to spend a lot of time and money! For those of you into DIY and garden equipment, it is a veritable paradise of selection and quality, and I am afraid, almost all at lower than UK prices.

Our house is a four-bedroom affair, with a large sun lounge at the back of our garage, which we have only just got around to cleaning. The only compromise was the steeply sloping driveway, which meant my brother-in-law and I had to undertake some concrete repairs to the roadway to allow the Audi access to the garage. We've also acquired a second car, which, quel surprise, is another Polo.

Erica has adapted well, and her head is gradually hardening to the tiled floors. We now know where the local Casualty department is, thanks to Erica's forward roll down the stairs complete with stair gate. No serious damage, just some blood from her teeth going through her lip, and a rather bruised face for a day or two.

Our house is in a small village of around 50-60 houses about 8km from Martigues. The countryside around is quite rocky, with a lot of pine trees, and the ubiquitous vines. Our first runs have been fairly tame "on-road" affairs, since the hunting season is in full swing. There are no access restrictions during hunting, and we are assured it is quite safe, but our other excuse is that we have not yet obtained a 1:50,000 or similar map to confirm all the various mountain paths and tracks nearby. The council are busy installing more kilometres of cycle paths along the road through our village, and cycling is definitely the sport around here, though there are a surprising number of runners too.

The only facilities in the village are a primary school and a wine cave, oh and a pizza van each evening, but so far we have only got around to sampling the local wine. The beaches are around a 10 minute drive from the house, and at this time of year are not overly busy, despite the 20-25°C temperatures in the sun. Some of the locals do in fact sport jumpers and fleeces when promenading along the coastal path, whilst we sport shorts and sandals!

We've tried to contact the local orienteering club in Aix-en-Provence, though they obviously don't have a very efficient webmaster or equivalent, since they have not yet replied. Perhaps, of course, it was my French! There was an event in the forests around our village during May this year, so we should have some progress on this front before too long we hope.

Our visitors have been and gone. They arrived a week after we moved in, though there were extenuating circumstances: Alison's sister's husband is a

policeman with fixed holidays. They used BA's Go (www.go-fly.com) to travel to London Stansted, and then KLM's Buzz (www.buzzaway.com) to fly from Stansted to Marseille. Buzz advertise fares as low as £29 to Marseille from London, so it can be a fairly cheap trip!


